

PREFACE

Christians, as we enter the sacred cycle of the Church's calendar for the year 2026, we are invited once again to journey through the mysteries of Christ from His Incarnation to His Passion, Resurrection, and Ascension culminating in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and the unfolding of Ordinary Time.

This year follows Year A of the Sunday Lectionary, beginning with the First Sunday of Advent on November 30, 2025, and concluding on November 22, 2026, the Feast of Christ the King.

This year, 2026, let us be reminded of our 50th Anniversary Theme: *“CELEBRATING OUR GOLDEN PAST, SERVING OUR PRESENT AND ENVISIONING OUR FUTURE TOGETHER”*. *This inspired theme would be our guide to navigate the chartered ocean of ACOM for the next 50 years of mission.*

The 2026 lectionary has few and new insertions such as the instruction of the ringing of bells, blowing of conch shells and beating of wooden drums, the Angelus and Regina Coeli, and the Collect for Good Shepherd Sunday. Let the ringing of bells, blowing of conch shells, and beating of wooden drums mark the beginning of each liturgical celebration, a joyful summons to the faithful. Whether at dawn, noon, or nightfall, the sound of bells, conch shells and drums echoes the voice of the Church calling her children to prayer, reflection, and praise.

Throughout Ordinary Time and the seasons of Advent and Lent, the Angelus may be recited at morning, noon, and evening. This devotion, recalling the Incarnation, is a fitting rhythm to accompany the daily lectionary readings and deepen our awareness of Christ's presence in time. Let this prayer be a gentle pause in the day, aligning our hearts with Mary's fiat and the mystery of the Word made flesh.

During the Easter season from Easter Sunday (April 5, 2026) through Pentecost (May 24, 2026) the Regina Coeli replaces the Angelus. This joyful antiphon celebrates the Resurrection and Mary's role in salvation history. Let this hymn be sung or recited with gladness, especially at morning, noon and evening.

The 2026 Lectionary also reminds us to pray for each ACOM diocese and the Anglican Communion, the religious and ministries. We will pray for some ACOM dioceses on the date of their inauguration. Dioceses such as Ysabel, and Vanuatu/New Caledonia will be on the consecration date of their current bishops, and the Diocese of Malaita, on the Third Sunday of Easter. Let us not get tired of doing good by praying earnestly to God for each other.

Finally, ACOM is almost at the end of the Decade of Evangelism and Intentional Discipleship (2017-2027). How deep have we gone in our evangelism programs? How wide have we gone in our Intentional Discipleship programs?

To conclude, as the body of Christ, let us celebrate the mystery of Christ together by using this lectionary wisely with the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Let us remain faithful in calling one another to worship and praise God by using the bells, conch shells, and drums. Pausing through time and space with Angelus and Regina Coeli. To God be the glory. Amen.

THE ANGLICAN CHURCH OF MELANESIA (ACOM) MISSION STATEMENT

The Mission Statement of the Anglican Church of Melanesia sets the direction for the church in its life and service to the people. The Statement was agreed upon at the 10th General Synod in 2011. The statement is as follows:

English Version

Our purpose is to be a faithful part of Christ's Body through exercising our baptismal ministries of: spreading the Good News of God's love in Jesus Christ, being like Christ in thought, word and action, worshipping God in spirit and truth; using wisely and taking good care of the natural resources and environment as well as all things entrusted to us for the extension of God's kingdom in the world and demonstrating God's love in responding to human need in loving service.

1. INTERCESSIONS

- (a) At the top of each page, there are topics for prayer and thanksgiving. The priest or catechist is to make sure those leading the prayers of the people during the Eucharist can fit these topics at appropriate places during the Intercessions. Those giving thanks are to be instructed that thanksgiving at this point is to be kept short, so as not to obscure the Great Thanksgiving, which is the main prayer of thanks in the Eucharist, giving the sacrament its name. Sometimes it will be more appropriate to use the Alternative Intercession, which permits shortening and additions. This is desired at daily celebrations when time is at a premium. Thought must be exercised so that the Liturgy is kept fresh and meaningful, and that the prayers offered by the people are both general for all needs and specific to the local needs and concerns of the worshipping community.
- (b) Those leading the Intercessions at the Holy Eucharist or after the collect for grace or help against all dangers at Morning or Evening Prayer should choose their subjects (prayer points) for giving thanks to God and for asking his blessing. The topics at the top of the page are a guide. Prayers and Thanks should be offered with thought to the day or season being celebrated, the scriptural lessons proclaimed, and the sermon delivered.
- (c) Litanies from the Melanesian Prayer Book may be used on appropriate occasions, e.g., the Litany for Ember Days on those days or ordinations, Litany of Thanksgiving on special days, or the Litany for Missions at mission services, Litany of the Sufferings during times of reconciliation, or Lent.
- (d) The third topic for each week is from the Anglican Church of Melanesia Cycle of Prayer. This is to pray each week for a diocese and institution or a particular group of people.
- (e) Within the Anglican Communion, there are also specific requests to pray for a Province, Network, or other institutions. These are specified in the fourth topic. As there are now too many dioceses in the Communion to be covered in our Lectionary. Those who want to use the Anglican Cycle of Prayer are encouraged to try to find a printed copy or to download the topics from the Anglican Communion website, www.anglicancommunion.org.sb

2. CLASSIFICATION OF HOLY DAYS IN THE ACOM

After the name of each feast or holy day, there is a number in Roman numerals (I, II, or III). This number refers to the class or importance of a particular day. For days of local commemoration, such as the first priest of an island, or former missionaries, no number is given. This is to avoid confusion between saints observed by all Christians everywhere, e.g. St. Francis, Patrick, and Alban, and our Melanesian saints. Others, such as Mother Emily and Ini Kopuria, are observed in other provinces, so they receive a class III.

Please note that it is always proper to change the class on a holy day if there is a good reason to do so. For example, if your church is dedicated to St. Francis of Assisi, on October 4, you will note that it is a Class III holy day. It can be changed to a Class I by celebrating a first Evensong, using the right colours, proper Lessons, and most of all, celebrating a sung Liturgy.

CLASS I These days are all the Major Holy Days of the Church. All the festivals of our Lord and a few others are Class I. There is always a first evensong and a second evensong. Morning Prayer, The Holy Eucharist, and both evensongs have proper psalms and lessons appropriate to the day. The Holy Eucharist is sung, and the Creed and Gloria are used. These Major Holy Days are never transferred unless they fall during Holy Week or Easter Week. Baptism, Confirmation, and Ordination are appropriate for these days, but not funerals or weddings.

CLASS II These are all Feasts of the apostles and evangelists, and some others. Sometimes there is a first evensong. There are propers for the day, i.e. appropriate collects, psalms,

and lessons. The Second Order provides other propers, such as prefaces and blessings, sentences, etc. The Eucharist should be sung, and the Creed and the Gloria are used. These are also appropriate for Baptism, Confirmation, and Ordination. Weddings and funerals may be held on these days as well.

CLASS III These are the days for other saints and special days. There are usually no proper psalms and lessons at the Offices or the Eucharist, but a proper collect for the Holy Day may be used (but not in Advent or Lent). The Eucharist is not usually sung. The Gloria may be used (except in Advent and Lent), but not the Creed.

LOCAL COMMEMORATIONS These are observed as for Class III.

Sundays are all Class I Holy Days because they are festivals of our Lord on which we give thanks for the Resurrection of Christ. Therefore, every Saturday evening there is a first evensong for the Sunday. On Saturday evenings, use only the Collect for the next day.

If it is desired to upgrade a holy day to a Class I festival for which there are no proper changes, change the Psalms and Lessons which are appointed for that day to the following commons:

1st Evensong for Patronal Festival

3. TRANSFERRING OF HOLY DAYS

There are rules to be followed if a holy day is transferred to another day (usually the nearest Sunday). These rules are as follows:

- (a) No holy day is to be transferred to any Sunday in Advent, Lent, or Easter.
- (b) No holy day is to be transferred to any day during Holy Week or Easter Week. (Including the Second Sunday of Easter).
- (c) Any Class II festival or Class III day becomes Class I if it is a patronal or titular festival. If it falls on a Sunday outside of Advent, Lent, or Easter seasons, it may be kept on that day. ("Patronal" comes from "patron" and means the name of a saint after whom a church or institution is named. "Titular" comes from "title" and means the name of a church or institution named after an event in the life of our Lord, or one of his names, or titles, such as Ascension, Corpus Christi, Transfiguration, Visitation, Good Shepherd, etc., after which a church or institution is named.
- (d) Any Class II festival (not being a patronal or titular festival) that falls on a Sunday must be transferred to the next available weekday, but if that weekday is in Holy Week or Easter Week, then it is transferred to the first available weekday outside those times.
- (e) Any Class III Holy Days that fall in Holy Week or Easter Week are not observed that year.

4. NAMES OF SUNDAYS

Some Sundays have different names in the Lectionary than they have in the Prayer Book. The most important thing is the way of counting Sundays. The Prayer Book has Easter 1, but in the ACOM,

the official title of that Sunday is the Second Sunday of Easter. Even though popular usage people still use “Sundays after Trinity”, etc., on official documents, however, they are to be referred to as “Sundays after Pentecost”. Please make sure that even though the collect might be, for example, Trinity 4, the name of the Sunday is the ‘Fifth Sunday after Pentecost.’ The *Gesima* Sundays are now titled as Sundays before Lent, i.e., *Septuagesima* becomes ‘Third Sunday before Lent’. The Sunday next before Advent is Christ the King, etc.

5. DAYS OF SPECIAL OBSERVANCE

These are days appointed by the Church, civil or local authority. They may be recurring or only happen once. Recurring days of special observance include:

The quarterly **Ember Days** are days of abstinence and prayer for those in the sacred ministry, and for those exploring a vocation to the ordained ministry. They should be marked by abstinence and prayer (including the Litany for the Ember Days at the Eucharist and/or the Daily Office), perhaps by special offerings for theological students in the Diocese, region, or parish/district. The colour is purple.

The Rogation Days are observed by asking God's blessings on the resources he has given us. These days include giving witness to our faith in the Rogation Procession (the procession is purple, the Eucharist is white). These days need to be celebrated creatively, in light of worldwide environmental concerns.

There are **days celebrated by organisations** within the Church, such as the Mothers' Union, the MBH and Companions, the SSF and TSSF, the CSC and Associates, CSM and Associates, Girls' Friendly Society, Melanesian Guild of Servers, Catechists and Lay Preachers, Men's Fellowships, Youth Groups, and Sunday Schools, etc. These are to be coordinated with the Rector or District Priest and may be celebrated on free days or Class III days. They may be celebrated on Class II days (or as Class II days) if they are significant to the organisation and do not contravene the tables of precedence above, or overshadow the saint or event celebrated on that day.

6. READING THE LESSONS

The Word of God is very precious, and every effort must be made so that the Lessons are proclaimed well during public worship. Good readers with clear speaking voices should be used, and others should be trained by the priest, teacher, or other person skilled at reading, to read better. It is not worthy of the Word of God for people to read at public worship if they cannot read properly or if they cannot be heard or understood. If at all possible, the Bible should be read in a language the people understand, or if no translation exists, the priest or catechist should explain the passage to them in a language they understand.

Always prepare the Lessons before the service begins.

If a passage starts with something that refers to an earlier passage that is not going to be read, change the word so that it makes sense. For example, if the appointed passage starts with something like “He told the people to sit down...” look to see WHO told the people to sit down and then make the change, e.g., “Jesus told the people to sit down”. Another example might be a passage that starts, “He went on from there and came to Jerusalem”. Look at the earlier passage and find out WHO went WHERE. Then the passage might be read: “Jesus went on from Bethany and came to Jerusalem.”

7. SPECIAL NOTES ON HOW THE PSALMS AND LESSONS ARE SHOWN IN THIS LECTIONARY

- (a) Psalm 25, 26, 130 - The Whole of Psalm 25, the whole of Psalm 26, and the whole of Psalm 130. It is permitted to use only one if desired.

- (b) Luke 5:27-32 – Luke chapter 5, verses 27 to 32 inclusive.
- (c) Acts 2:14, 22-32 – Acts chapter 2, verse 14 and verses 22 to 32 inclusive.
- (d) Acts 12:24- -13:5 – Acts chapter 12, verses 24 to the end and chapter 13, verses 1 to 5 inclusive.
- (e) 1 Cor. 12:12-30a – 1st Corinthians chapter 12, verse 12 to the end of the first sentence of verse 30.
- (f) 1 Cor. 12:30b-13:1 end – 1st Corinthians chapter 12, starting at the last sentence of verse 30 and ending at the last verse of chapter 13.
- (g) Isa.. 15 – The whole of Isaiah chapter 15.
- (h) Philemon – The whole of Paul's letter to Philemon.

Feast of the Holy Family, the First Sunday after Christmas

Father of all, you give identity to us all by our relationships with others: Inspire us by the Holy Family of Nazareth that together, our lives may always grow in wisdom, love, and forgiveness, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and rules with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Inauguration of the Church of the Province of Melanesia, January 26

Eternal Father, by your providence, you led the establishment in these islands of the Church of Melanesia as a true part of the catholic and Apostolic Church: Lead this Province by your Holy Spirit; fill us with wisdom and love, that our present plans may find future fulfilment by your will. To the glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and rules with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Saint Joseph, March 19

God our Father, from the family of your servant David, you raised Joseph the carpenter to be the guardian of your incarnate Son and the husband of his mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary: Give us grace to follow him in faithful obedience to your commands, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Feast of Good Shepherd (Fourth Sunday after Easter)

O God, whose Son Jesus Christ is the Good Shepherd of your people: Grant that, when we hear his voice, we may know him who calls us each by name, and follow where he leads; who, with you and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Or

Merciful Father, you gave your Son Jesus Christ to be the good shepherd, and in his love for us to lay down his life and rise again. Keep us always under his protection, and give us grace to follow in his steps; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**

George Augustus Selwyn, April 11

Almighty Father, through your inspiration, Bishop George Augustus Selwyn planted the Church in the Southern Isles: Keep us steadily growing in true religion, sound learning, and useful industry, and in lives of justice and compassion; through the Shepherd and Bishop of our souls, Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**

The Seven Martyred Brothers of the Melanesian Brotherhood, April 24

Eternal Father, in the lives and deaths of the seven martyred Brothers you show us that the Cross is not an experience but a present reality: Help us to recognise its power to liberate your people; and, like Brothers Nathaniel, Robin, Francis, Alfred, Ini, Patteson, and Tony, to live and die in humility and love, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**

The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Elizabeth, May 31

Almighty God, by your grace Elizabeth rejoiced with Mary and greeted her as the mother of The Lord: Look with favour on your lowly servants that, with Mary, our hearts may be full of praise and always magnify your holy Name, through Jesus Christ our Lord who lives and rules with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Blessed Virgin Mary, August 15

Almighty God, you took to yourself the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of your only Son: Grant that we, who have been redeemed by his blood, may share with her in the glory of your eternal kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and rules with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary, September 8

Almighty Father, in your plan for the salvation of the world, Mary the Virgin was born and she chose to cooperate with you in the incarnation of your Son our Lord: We give you thanks for her birth, and as you chose her and made her fit to be the mother of your Son Jesus Christ, so let it be to us according to your Word, who lives and rules with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Joseph Atkin, Stephen Taroniara & the Martyrs of Melanesia, September 27

Almighty God, we remember before you this day Stephen Taroniara, Joseph Atkin, and the blessed martyrs of Melanesia, who, following the example of their Saviour, laid down their lives for their friends; and pray that we who honour their memory may follow their loyalty and faith, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and rules with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Whit Monday (Monday after Pentecost)

God our Father, your Son promised the Holy Spirit to all who believe in him: So fill us with your Spirit, that we may do with joy the works you have made ready for us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**

Tuesday to Saturday after Pentecost

Eternal Father, you have revealed your love for your people in the outpouring of your Holy Spirit: Evermore fill us with your Spirit, that as we grow in age we may grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

National Days

Edwin Nobbs and Fisher Young

These two were Norfolk Islanders. They were on the schooner Southern Cross II and taught at summer school with Pritt and Palmer in 1864. On their return voyage, the vessel went to Santa Cruz. As they were landing, Fisher Young was shot in the left wrist, and as Edwin Nobbs jumped up to take his oar, he was shot in the left cheek. When the vessel reached Vanua Lava, Fisher Young died and was buried there. Edwin Nobbs was buried at sea.

John Coleridge Patteson

The first missionary Bishop of Melanesia was a protégé of Bishop G.A. Selwyn. He travelled among the islands in the Southern Cross and was most effective in his pastoral and educational work. The people of Nukapu were greatly disturbed by the kidnapping of some of their number by labour trading vessels, and it is said, had resolved to kill the next white man to visit their island. Thus on the 20th September 1871, when Patteson landed on Nukapu with a chief he knew to be a friend from a previous visit, he was clubbed to death as he lay resting in a house by another man bent on revenge. His death made a deep impression throughout Melanesia, and in New Zealand and England aroused much interest in missionary work and the practice of blackbirding in the South Pacific.

Stephen Taroniara and Joseph Atkin

Taroniara was a Solomon Island teacher and Atkin a New Zealand priest working in the Melanesian Mission. They were attacked and wounded as they waited on the reef for Bishop Patteson when he went ashore at Nukapu where he was killed. Both later died of their wounds and were buried at sea.

Arthur Ako

He was a teacher who founded a school at Fiu, Malaita. He was killed by a heathen in 1904 not far from his garden.

Thomas Amasia

There were many attacks on the Christian schools of Malaita, all carried out by heathen bushmen. Amasia founded the school at Ngongorefou and was killed there.

Charles Christopher Godden

Godden was a priest from Australia and attached to the Melanesian Mission at Lolowai, Ambae in the Penama group of Vanuatu. He was killed by a returning labourer from Queensland who had been in prison and was looking for revenge on some white man. Although he knew the danger, Godden had a service to conduct and felt his duty to go. He was shot in the left leg and then killed with an axe. His last words were, "Let there be no fighting because of me."

Brother Thomas Peo

Thomas Peo was a member of the Melanesian Brotherhood sent to the heathen of Santa Cruz. He was shot and killed by an arrow. He was the first Brother to be martyred.

Two priests, John Barge and Bernard Moore, died in New Britain during the Japanese occupation in the Second World War. New Britain was then part of the Diocese of Melanesia, so they are sometimes regarded as Martyrs of Melanesia but more generally now as Martyrs of Papua New Guinea.

John Barge

Barge was a priest who worked in the Ghak-Moewe district of New Britain, then a part of the Diocese of Melanesia, but now a part of the Province of Papua New Guinea. Despite the Japanese advance during the war, he chose to remain with his people. He was captured by the Japanese, taken to Kandrian in Moewe Harbour, and was beheaded. He was a brave man and stayed with his people to the end even though he might have saved himself. Bishop Baddeley said of him, "That kind of death is not death but a glorious victory."

Bernard Moore

Like Barge, Moore was a priest who did not desert his people. He was also killed by the Japanese.

THE SEVEN MARTYRED BROTHERS OF THE MELANESIAN BROTHERHOOD**Brother Nathaniel Sado**

The lost brother for whom the other six had gone in search of, was loved and trusted by everyone; people, animals, or life in general. That trust was abused by someone he knew and called a friend and he was the first Brother to die, being tortured and beaten to death.

Brother Robin Lindsay

He was from Papua New Guinea and was Assistant Head Brother for four years, then Regional Head Brother in PNG. While studying theology at BPTC, Kohimarama, he was asked in 2003 to take on the responsibilities of Assistant Head Brother again. He was called the Encourager for he had time for everyone and was wise in giving advice.

Brother Francis Tofi

He was a man with deep spiritual insight gentle wisdom and bravery. He was a courageous peacemaker. He was to have gone to the World Council of Churches Bossy Institute in Geneva to take part in reconciliation studies.

Brother Alfred Hilly

He was a quiet brother of great kindness who had a great care for children. He was trained in malaria research and a qualified technician.

Brother Ini Paravabatu

He was a free-spirited and brave man of energy and a brilliant actor in religious drama. He bravely spoke out against injustices and upheld the rights of all people.

Brother Patteson Gatu

He was a young man, joyful and warm with a confident faith in God. He made Jesus' Beatitude come alive: "Blessed are the peacemakers."

Brother Tony Sirihi

He was someone who never lost his humble simplicity, a natural and unassuming friend of all. He showed his courage throughout the ethnic tension and continued to help in the disarmament process.

12. LITURGICAL NOTES

Ringling of Bells to Call to Worship

(Especially the use of bells, drums, or conch shells to call people to worship).

Bells, drums or conch shells are commonly used throughout the ACOM to call people, to worship, and or to rally people for important community activities. To avoid confusion, the ACOM Commission on Faith and Order decided that in calling people to worship, bells, conch-shells or wooden drums are used according to the following sequence:

- a) First call (a bell or conch-shell is rung or blown 24 times; a wooden drum is beaten for 5 minutes: this is what we use to refer to as Rising Drum or Bell), symbolising the 24 Elders (Revelation 4:4) worshipping God in Heaven, inviting us to worship.
- b) Second call (a bell or conch-shell is rung or blown 12 times; a wooden drum is beaten for 3 minutes), symbolising the 12 Disciples of Jesus calling us to worship.
- c) Third Bell (a bell or conch-shell is rung or blown 7 times; a wooden drum is beaten for 2 minutes), symbolising the 7 Sacraments that our Church ACOM accepts and teaches that are Sacraments of the Church of God.
- d) Fourth call (a bell is rung 3 times) signifying the Triune God (Father, Son & Holy Spirit), invoking our response: "I AM HERE" to worship you. The service begins immediately after this bell.

The length of time between each call should be between 5-10 minutes; however, consideration should be given for cases where people do not live near their churches.

The Regina Coeli and Angelus Bells

(Traditionally used during the Eastertide and in memory of the Incarnation of God).

Regina Coeli

The Regina Coeli is a prayer to the Virgin Mary, traditionally sung from Easter Sunday until Pentecost. While the Regina Coeli is not a core part of Anglican liturgy like the Book of Common Prayer, some Anglican churches and individuals may choose to include it in services or use it in their personal prayer life. The ACOM Commission on Faith and Order has decided to insert the prayer since it is practised in our four Religious Communities, and it can be used in our institutions, schools and the local Christian communities.

The prayer is also associated with a specific bell-ringing sequence. The sequence typically involves four sets of two strokes, with pauses between each set, followed by eight peals. This sequence is used in the morning, noon, and evening.

Bell-Ringing Instructions:

Morning, Noon, and Evening: The bell is rung at each of these times during the Easter season.

Four Sets of Two Strokes: The sequence begins with four sets of two strokes, with a brief pause between each set.

Eight Peals: After the four sets of two strokes, the bell is rung eight times in quick succession (peals). The Regina Coeli prayer is recited or sung after the bell rings.

The Regina Coeli Prayer.

Joy to you, O Queen of Heaven, Alleluia!
 Jesus you were fit to bear, Alleluia!
 As he promised, now he's risen, Alleluia!
 Pour for us to God your prayer. Alleluia!
 Rejoice and be happy, O Virgin Mary, Alleluia!
 For truly, the Lord has risen. Alleluia!

Let us pray.

O God,
 By the rising again of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ,
 you have given joy to the world:
 we pray you that we may receive
 the happiness of everlasting life;
 through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Angelus

The Angelus bells are rung in a specific pattern, typically three strokes three times, followed by a longer peal of nine strokes. This pattern is often accompanied by the recitation of the Angelus prayer, which includes three Hail Marys. The bells are traditionally rung at morning, noon, and evening, marking times for prayer and reflection on the Incarnation of Jesus. Whilst our four Religious Communities and our institutions and schools have used the prayer, the ACOM Commission on Faith and Order has also decided to insert it in the Lectionary so the local churches and the congregation can pray the prayer.

The Angelus Prayer.

The Angel of the Lord brought news to Mary,
And she was conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your body, Jesus.
Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Behold the servant of the Lord;
Let it be to me according to your word.

May God's help be with us always, and may the souls of those who died in faith, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Baptism

Baptism is the sacrament by which we become members of the Church, which is God's family, His people, and the Body of Christ. The baptismal formula, "*I baptise you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,*" or in cases where there is doubt whether the person to be baptised is still alive, "*If you are living, I baptise you...*" both imply that baptism can only be administered to those who are alive, both infants and adults. **Stillborn infants are not baptised**, but pastoral prayers are used to comfort and to assure parents that the infant belongs to God, and to help them understand that God's grace is sufficient to save newly born or stillbirth infants.

Genuflection**At the Incarnatus:**

Genuflection in the Incarnatus of the Nicene Creed is a liturgical gesture in honour of the Incarnation, of how God in Jesus became human. Genuflection is made by going down on the right knee. During the Creed, all go down after the words "he came down from heaven" at the words: "***and was made flesh by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary and became man***" everyone genuflects, then after the word "man" (or "human" in Second Order) all rise.

At the Eucharist:

During the Eucharist, do not genuflect when the elements are not yet consecrated on the altar during the offertory. Those who bring forward the alms and oblations should be taught to bow instead. Do not genuflect to the bare altar after the ablutions. Only genuflect when the consecrated sacrament is on the altar. The people genuflect before being seated only if the sacrament is on or near the altar, otherwise they bow. The procession genuflects only at the beginning and end of the service, and only then if the sacrament is reserved on or near the altar. Crucifers and acolytes never genuflect if they are holding a cross or candle stick whether the sacrament is on or near the altar or not. If the sacrament is reserved in a Lady Chapel or Blessed Sacrament Chapel, the procession makes a solemn bow.

At other times:

Genuflection is made by the people when entering and leaving their seats, or by people doing other things in the church, i.e. getting ready for the service, youth, choir practice, etc. if the sacrament is there, that is to say, if it is reserved in a tabernacle (ciborium for the Reserved Sacrament) or an ambry (a permanent niche in the wall for the Sacrament). If the sacrament is kept in a Lady Chapel or Sacrament of the Blessed Sacrament, or not reserved at all, then they bow towards the altar before and after prayer or other activity in the church house.

Position from which to read the Gospel

The Gospel is to be proclaimed either in the midst of the congregation or at Sanctuary, facing them. The priest should not face the wall with his back to the people when proclaiming the Gospel to them.

Replacement of the Reserved Sacrament

The Blessed Sacrament shall be renewed every week in places where it is reserved, if possible.

14. MOVEABLE FEAST DAYS

Easter is always the Sunday after the full moon that occurs on or after the equinox on March 21, a date which is fixed according to an ancient calculation of the Church, and which does not always correspond to the astronomical equinox. This full moon may happen on any date between March 21 and April 18 inclusive. If the full moon falls on a Sunday, Easter Day is always the following Sunday, but Easter Day can never be earlier than March 21 or later than April 25.

The date of Easter governs the cycle of feasts, dependent upon this, the most important feast. The number of Sundays after Epiphany and the number of Sundays after Pentecost depend on the date of Easter.

ASH WEDNESDAY is always the Wednesday on the fortieth weekday before Easter.

PALM SUNDAY is always the Sunday before Easter.

HOLY WEEK is always the week before Easter.

ASCENSION DAY is always the fortieth day after Easter.

PENTECOST is always the fiftieth day after Easter.

TRINITY SUNDAY is always the next Sunday after Pentecost

CORPUS CHRISTI is always on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday

ADVENT SUNDAY is always the Sunday closest to Saint Andrew's Day.

The Rogation Days are always the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before Ascension Day.

The Ember Days are Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after the second Sunday of Advent; the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after the First Sunday of Lent; the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday, after Pentecost; and the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after Holy Cross Day.

MOTHERING SUNDAY (or Mother's Day) is celebrated on the Fourth Sunday of Lent in the United Kingdom, whereas in the United States of America, it falls on the 2nd Sunday of May.

15. THE RESPONSORIAL PSALM

The Responsorial Psalm (sometimes a Canticle) is an ancient part of the Liturgy. In the early Church, Psalms were sung after the Lessons before the Gospel. Since most of the people could not read, the cantor or the choir sang the verses, and the people sang the response called an antiphon. In the Middle Ages, the Psalm was usually shortened to a single verse. Thomas Cranmer

restored the use of Psalms to the Eucharist in the first Book of Common Prayer, but because Morning Prayer always preceded the Eucharist until the 19th century, this provision was withdrawn in subsequent editions until the late last century.

The renewal of the Liturgy from the 1960s onward was a departure from earlier periods of renewal. The Catholic Revival in the Anglican Communion in the 19th century sought to recover for Anglicans the grandeur and pageantry of the Age of Faith. The 1960s renewal sought to go back further and recover for modern Christians the simplicity and dignity of the early Church's worship.

When the Lectionary was revised in the 1960s and 70s, it restored an Old Testament Lesson and a Responsorial Psalm. Our canons in Title B Canon 1 authorises certain lectionaries, and those listed always include the Responsorial Psalm. All editions of the Second Order of the Eucharist mention the Responsorial Psalm in the rubrics, but until now people have had to find their own Psalms and responses because they have not been printed in the Lectionary. Now the Lectionary of the Anglican Church of Melanesia is substantially the same as in the majority of Christians throughout the world.

Method

The best way of using the Responsorial Psalm is for the Cantor to be at the lectern while the people remain seated:

1. The cantor reads or chants (sings) the response (antiphon) to a simple tune.
2. The people repeat what the cantor just read or sang.
3. The cantor reads or sings two or three verses of the Psalm.
4. The people read or sing the response.
5. The cantor reads or sings the next two or three verses of the Psalm.
6. The people read or sing the response.

Steps 5 and 6 are repeated until the end of the Psalm or portion thereof when the cantor sits down and someone comes up to read the Epistle (or Gospel).

At Low Mass, the pattern is that, usually the person who reads the first lesson at the Eucharist will also lead the Psalm; the people remain seated.

1. The reader says the response (antiphon).
2. The people repeat it.
3. The cantor reads a verse or two of the Psalm.
4. The people say the response.
5. The cantor says the next two or three of the Psalm.
6. The people say the response.

Steps 5 and 6 are repeated until the end of the Psalm or portion thereof.

Choir, youth, and musical groups are encouraged to find new and simple tunes to sing the Psalms in worship. This will require a lot of effort, but that is what the word Liturgy means, it means the work of the people, not the just work of the clergy. The clergy will have to explain to the people about this enrichment of our worship.

Psalms in Worship

Anglicans love the Psalter so much that it is the only book of the Bible printed in the Book of Common Prayer in its entirety, and the Psalms are used in some way at every service. The Psalms are an integral part of the Divine Office of the Church. Try to learn chants and tunes for the Psalms, try reading or singing the Psalms with one side of the congregation responding to another, or divided between male and female voices, or with the congregation responding to the officiant or cantor.

Always reading the Psalms in unison can sometimes be a burden, and the exclusive use of a single method or a single tune makes worship boring. The first method in the Melanesian Prayer Book mentioned in both Morning and Evening Prayer is for the Psalms to be sung. A few elderly ACOM

people can still sing the Psalms, *Venite*, and *Jubilate* in Mota Language and English as well. It is good that our people learn again the power of singing the hymns God's people have been singing for the last 3000 years. Certain ACOM congregations are singing the Psalms again and it is hoped that this enrichment will become a welcome part of our worship to the honour and glory of God.

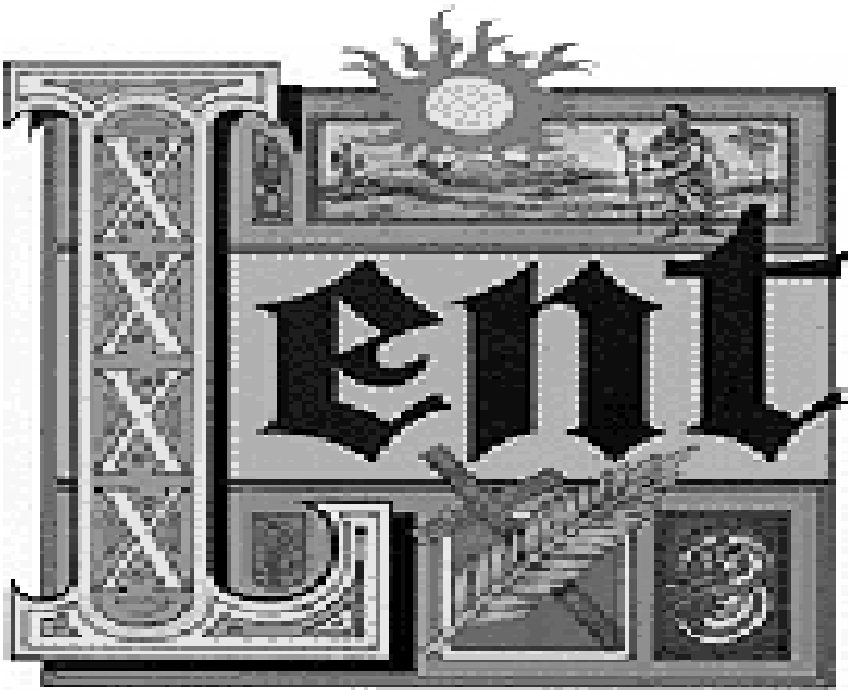

2. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence.
3. Minor saints' days falling in Lent are only commemorated.
4. No feasts may be observed on any Sunday in Lent, but are transferred.
5. No feasts or minor holy days are kept in Holy Week but are to be transferred to the week following the Second Sunday of Easter.
6. The Gloria in Excelsis (Glory be to God on high/Glory to God in the highest) is not said or sung on Sundays during Lent.
7. The Doxology (Glory be to the Father, etc.) is said throughout Lent except for Holy Week.
8. Baptisms are not conducted in Lent except for special cases. Baptisms are therefore held during the Easter Vigil.

HOLY WEEK



Before the First Evensong of Palm Sunday (on Saturday), crosses, statues and pictures are covered.

The *Gloria Patri* (Glory be to the Father, etc.) is not used at the beginning of Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer or the end of Psalms.

PALM SUNDAY

The colour for the Palm Sunday Procession is red. Palms are held during the Palm Gospel and Procession, but not during the Passion Gospel.

Normally, the congregation gathers at a place apart from the church, so that all may go into the church in procession.

The processional cross is carried uncovered. After the procession, the celebrant arrives at the altar and reverences (and censes) it. Then the celebrant goes to the Presider's Chair, (removes the cope and) vests in a chasuble; the Eucharist continues with the Collect for Palm Sunday.

The Passion Gospel is specified here in the lectionary, of which it is scripted out in the *Lent and Holy Week Services* book on pages 46, 57; 83; or 95 accordingly. The Passion Gospel should be read in parts by members of the congregation, but the celebrant should read the part of Christ. Gospel candles and incense are not used. In the beginning, there is no blessing for the reader and no *Gloria Tibi* (Glory be to you, O Lord or another translation). In the end, the Bible is not kissed, nor is the *Laus Tibi* (Praise be to you, O Christ, or another translation of the same) used.

MONDAY, TUESDAY, AND WEDNESDAY OF HOLY WEEK

The Office of Morning Prayer and the Holy Eucharist is celebrated for Lent. The Office of Tenebrae in the Lent and Holy Week book is provided to mark these days. Tenebrae is celebrated only after sunset, never before.

MAUNDY THURSDAY

Morning: Morning Prayer is offered as usual. Members of the Clergy who can do so, meet with the Bishop for the renewal of ordination vows; the consecration of Holy Chrism and the blessing of the oil for the sick. The colour is white.

Evening: For the Evening Eucharist the colour is white. The altar is decorated for feasts. Bells and drums are rung or beaten during the *Gloria in Excelsis*, and remain silent until the Easter Vigil. The Creed is not used, nor is there a blessing. After the post Communion prayer, there is a procession to the Altar of Repose. There must be a light near the Reserved Sacrament.

After the procession with the Sacred Elements to the Altar of Repose, the high altar is stripped and washed *with water* during the reading of Psalm 22.

Congregation leave quietly after the service as a time of 'watch and pray' is maintained throughout the night.

GOOD FRIDAY

The colour of the day is red.

The Solemn Liturgy for Good Friday should begin about 3:00 pm, but for pastoral reasons may take place between noon and 9:00 pm.

The Sacred Ministers wear vestments throughout.

The altar is completely bare at the start of the Liturgy.

Devotions such as the Stations of the Cross, Litany of the Sufferings, and/or the Seven Words may be used in addition to, but not in place of, the Liturgy for Good Friday.

HOLY SATURDAY

The Eucharist is not celebrated on this day. A Service of the Word may be offered if desired.

The Vigil Eucharist should be celebrated at a convenient time between sunset on Saturday and sunrise on Sunday.

The Sacred Ministers wear white or gold vestments throughout.

At the *Gloria in Excelsis*, bells are rung and drums are beaten.

In the Gospel, incense is carried but not candles.

The Lessons for Easter Vigil are provided in the Lent and Holy Week book.

Priests who celebrate or concelebrate at the Easter Vigil may do so again at the second (morning) Eucharist of Easter.

Those who receive Holy Communion at the Vigil Eucharist may do so again at later celebrations.

1. The Paschal Candle is placed at the Gospel (north) side of the chancel, i.e. on the left side from the people's perspective.
2. It should be lit at every service from the Easter Vigil until after Evensong on Pentecost Day.
3. Light the Paschal Candle BEFORE the people gather, i.e. after the first bell; it is not lighted ceremonially with the altar lights.
4. Put out the Paschal Candle AFTER the people leave. Do not let the servers put it out with the altar candles. It stays burning until the people have gone, after announcements, and a final hymn. It is put out before other activities, such as MU prayers, parish meetings, etc.
5. If a church's resources are limited and a small Paschal Candle may not last till Ascension, the Candle may be lit only for main services.
6. The Paschal Candle should be brought back into the church for Baptism. The candles given to the godparents are lit from the Paschal Candle. (1 Peter 3:21)
7. The Paschal Candle should be brought back into the church for funerals. It is placed near the left corner of the coffin (or dead body) nearest the altar. (1 Corinthians 15:12-13, Romans 8:37-39)
8. The *Regina Coeli* is rung instead of the Angelus from Easter morning until the evening of Pentecost; the *Angelus* is rung again starting on the morning of Whit Monday. *Angelus* is rung in 3 sets of 3 strokes followed by 9 single strokes. *Regina Coeli* is 2 sets of 9 strokes.
9. No other feasts or holy days may be kept during Easter Week, but are transferred to the week following the Second Sunday of Easter.
10. A main holy day falling on Easter, the Second Sunday of Easter, Pentecost or Trinity Sunday is to be transferred.
11. The Rogation Procession may be repeated to cover all areas from Sunday to Wednesday in the week before Ascension according to need.
12. Celebrations and prayers for Christian Unity need to be planned for well in advance with leaders from other faith communities, so ACOM and other Christians may celebrate together meaningfully.
